PASTOR ALASTAIR

It's amazing what can happen in a year. And every year, our testimony should be: "The Lord has been with me this year." That phrase can equally be used in good years, or tough years. We need to search for and find God in both!

It has been a good year at church. For the past few years, the Elders have identified prayer as an area of potential growth for us as a church. A personal highlight for me has been seeing our prayer burns, more prayer meetings, more focused prayer meetings, increased development of our prayer chain, our new prayer room and people praying for each other after church and in the foyer and during the week. Prayer changes things!

Prayer has changed our Light Party! The last two years, at Night Church before the Light Party we have simply prayed. Last year at the Light Party, we saw an amazing storm swirl around our site, while we got a light shower. Then two weeks before this year's Light Party, we baptised an ex-gang member who first came to church at... a Light Party! This year, we set up a Church Enquiry gazebo and had 39 people sign up to do Alpha. Then the winner of the colouring competition came to church to receive his prize, his Mum made a commitment that week and was baptised the following Sunday! What a celebration!

This should inspire us! We need to be a church that prays well! We need to be a church that offers people the opportunity to become followers of Jesus and change their entire eternity! We will ONLY be a church like that if INDIVIDUALS pray and INDIVIDUALS tell people the good news about Jesus!

Another highlight this year was leading a short term mission team to the Philippines. We had an amazing time, did too much, yet God looked after us! Each step we felt like we had to seek God with what to do and how to do it. A team of 12 people aged 15-72 made for an interesting looking team, but it was an awesome team up for anything God sent our way!

We have had amazing stability as a staff. This changes as Pastor Garey steps into a new role. I have huge gratitude for all he has done. Garey is unbelievably unflappable – his rock stability has been invaluable to me personally! On behalf of the church, thank you for all you have done for us and we are glad that you will still be around! We are currently looking for a replacement for him. Suz is also currently in the process of potentially being appointed as a new pastor for us. At different times, God leads us into a season of change, and that will be us in the next few months. This can throw us... or we can look with a sense of excitement with what is ahead. Let's pray hard and see what God will do!

We have had some new ministries and initiatives start this year – Mainly Music as an example. I love that we have a "can do" attitude as a church to bring on new ministries. And I love how new ministries integrate into the life of the church. Mainly Music compliments Flavor Café which complements our Space young Mums program which complements our Sunday Morning programs. We always need to look for good pathways as people come into our community and good pathways to come to faith.

Next year, we need to continue to grow in the area of prayer, we need personal challenge in seeing people come to faith and we will be looking to develop our discipleship options to help people grow in their faith. We also want to continue to look at how we better reach our community with the good news of Jesus.

We, the church, are described as the "Bride" of Christ. A bride is never perfect, but she does everything she can to prepare for her groom coming. We aren't a perfect community – we are real! But we are on a mission and we need to be prepared for that in 2018.

You are an awesome church - continue to respond to God's call to action, service, love, commitment and care. Thank you to all who have served, given, shared and cared. How we care and respect each other says so much to a hurting world! A special thanks to our staff and ministry leaders – God has blessed us richly with amazing people.

Older Adult Ministries

...or as we affectionately describe it "Youth Group for Seniors" has filled a vital need in our community meeting the social and spiritual needs of our older adults. This ministry has five components, each operating once a month. The first Friday of the month was "Come Walking" an opportunity to exercise and explore our local community. The second Friday was Chapel, a service of worship using traditional songs to meet the spiritual needs of this older generation. We have had a variety of speakers this year from mission organisations. The third Friday has been "Soul Talk" which has provided an opportunity to discuss matters of the heart from a Biblical perspective.

The fourth Friday is "Super Friday" and this event is designed to meet the fellowship needs of people. We have had a number of people turning up from the community to check us out and who end up staying. When there is a fifth Friday we hop in the church van and head out on an adventure, exploring new places. This is always a great time. We do all these things so people get to fellowship and hear the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Church Care

We use the phrase "Church Care" instead of pastoral care because we think it more accurately reflects who is involved with the pastoral care – everyone! Everyone in church has the opportunity to provide the ministry of care to others. It is heartening to see the numbers of people that are involved in the lives of others providing support and care. This is particularly important when people are experiencing major illness or significant life events. Numbers of people have joined a roster so meals can be provided for the families experiencing difficult times. The reports back from families who have received such meals is gratitude and appreciation. They feel so loved and supported.

Two seminars were held during the year to train people in the art of caring for their friends. A training seminar was also held to equip our welcoming team to confidently carry out their duties.

Men's Ministry

Throughout this year a group of men who completed the Man to Man course last year have been meeting monthly for breakfast as a way to offer one another support as they endeavour to put into practice what they learned last year.

We held a breakfast for all the men of the church early in the year and invited a number of our own men to share something of their faith journey.

Our Mens course this year was entitled "Conquer." The course was well attended and challenging to everyone. The reason we offer such courses is that we want to be a church that doesn't avoid the tough issues but that we address them head on and call our men to living out something great! There is a line in the Lion King Movie that says "You are more than what you have become" and that is true for most people that there is more in them and they just need the right encouragement to grow into their full potential.



Connect Groups

For many years we called our home groups small groups, this year we started referring to them as connect groups. The reason for this was to use the name to reflect the purpose of these groups - connect to others and connect to God. Connect groups are thriving in the younger age groups of the church. They are an expected part of the activities they do from week to week. In the upper age groups those who attend a group really enjoy the opportunity they have to connect socially and spiritually. We have a good number of special interest groups, such as the Indian Fellowship, Pasifika, Maori, and even groups like Unicycle club do a great job of connecting people. They do an excellent job of including people in

the life of the church. The prayer groups that now meet monthly all do a wonderful job of connecting people to one another and the Lord too. The vision for connect groups is that they happen naturally, two or three meeting for support and encouragement. Sometimes this process needs help so if you think the Lord is calling you to start a group, please talk to any of the staff and they'll support you to get it happening!

Food for Thought

This year again in conjunction with an organisation called Kiwi Harvest and NZMA a catering training organisation we have been able to provide frozen meals to families who were in need of some TLC. We also have a team of dedicated people who are willing to prepare and deliver fresh meals to families who have had babies and they have done a fantastic job. Many thanks to Megan Carter for her wonderful leadership skills to make this all happen and to her team of people willing to provide a meal and deliver them. These are small acts of kindness that go a long way to letting people know they are loved and supported. Thank you to all who help.

Facilities Team, Welcome Team, Parking Team and Offering Team

Every Sunday morning there is a team of people who arrive early and leave late to make all experiences at church, smooth. They ensure the facilities are fit for use and when you are heading home they are staying to lock up. These behind the scene roles are like the grease in moving cogs, you soon notice when it's not there. This can be said of the team that count the offering each week, the team that helps park your car and the people who greet you at the door. If they weren't there, church would be a less friendly place. Say hi and thank them for their service next time you see them.

PASTOR MARTY

God at Work! 2017 seems to have gone faster than I thought possible! It's great to look back and really see that God is moving amongst our young people and wider church. We have welcomed new faces this year and seen young people take bold and courageous steps in their Faith.

GAP

On any given Wednesday night you might find 30-40 young people around church. We always want to try and push our young people to explore what it means to follow Jesus and how to grow their own Faith. Small groups are a really important part of our nights and we couldn't do Gap without our incredible volunteers. This year we ran the Youth Alpha course, which was superb for encouraging questions and conversation. We also spent time looking at specific grey areas in life (money, mental health, relationships and politics!) – things that are relevant for youth, but don't always get talked about in church circles. There have been some of the regular favourites like HUB nights and Gap Church too. We have had guest speakers and always have a great night. If you have high school aged young people in your house – this is a great place for them to be on a Wednesday night. Again we have also had a number of our young people get baptised this year and I always love these times as they share their journeys of how God is changing them.

Easter Camp

Always a highlight - especially as we go as a part of The South Auckland Hub, along with Bridge Community Church, PACT/Papatoetoe Community Church, Papakura Wesleyan, Manurewa Baptist and Franklin Baptist. It is great for us to be part of a group of youth communities that each brings a different flavour to our combined group.

One of the highlights for me this year has been to see a young man who arrived from overseas, join our youth, but in no time has become settled, accepted and is now thriving in our youth community, thanks to the community of young people and the great input of our amazing leaders.

I have also been incredibly surprised as often on a Wednesday night, if you are here to pick up your 17 or 18 year old son, you almost have to drag them away as they are engaged in small group conversation, Bible discussion and prayer!! Who would have thought...

GAP Band

We have just started a new initiative of musician mentorship with our young people and our existing music teams – so I am excited to see more of our young people using their giftings in this area in the very near future.

Night Church

Again this Year Night Church seems to have shifted a gear; we are seeing God continue to work, speak into and change people. We have looked at a number of different series, and I love the excitement and energy that is present amongst young and old. The café teams are amazing and it really is the best place to be on a Sunday Evening!

Papatoetoe High School

This year I again taught the Yr Choice Relationship classes at Papatoetoe High as well as doing the 1st XI Girls Football coaching with Gabby Frank. The response from both teachers and students is always so positive and reminds me of our need to be a good voice within the community. We also had Neda and Erin coaching the Girls 2nd XI Football team again this year.

Where to next?

There is always a challenge to get alongside our young people and encourage them to grow. As a wider church we all have a role to play in that. One of the things we are looking at establishing is a youth committee that will help steer and give input into the things that we do as a youth group. We will also look to strengthen the crossover between our intermediates, high schoolers and young adults as well as the rest of the church. God has some exciting things in the pipeline for us!





FAITH DEVELOPMENT

IGNITE PRAYER MINISTRY

Our team consists of 15 committed members who are rostered each second Sunday. This team is available to pray for anyone who comes forward in response to the message on a Sunday morning or for any other reason.

We have had three new people join our team this year. Feel free to contact any of the church staff if you would like to get more involved in praying for others.

It is exciting to now be under the 'Ignite' umbrella which has united all the different prayer groups within the church. We meet once a term to share what is happening in our different groups, to encourage each other and (surprise!)...to pray together!

Some of our members pray through houses upon request and this has made a difference in the lives of the families in these homes. We also have prayed when requested for individuals who benefit from a longer time than is able to be given after a service.

Whether the answer to a prayer is immediate or takes a while, we know God hears prayer and answers according to His plan for his loved children.

We are not always given feedback after praying for someone and because this is

a confidential ministry, we are not able to share personal details in this report. However, some of the instances of prayer this year –

- A leg shorter than the other that God grew out to become the same length as the other.
- A shoulder that was similar to being frozen, but after prayer, movement became freer.
- A young woman was prayed for, who was suffering from depression and she reported feeling better the next week.
- A family came in off the street looking for something special in their lives and through prayer and encouragement their lives are completely changed.
- A young person who found it difficult to get to sleep at night, or if they did get to sleep, often the sleep was broken through the night. After praying with this person they have been sleeping much better every night since.
- Other instances covered such things as marriage difficulties, cultural issues and specific response to sermons.

Some of the team were also able to attend a day at the Alpha Weekend away and pray with several of the participants.

God is AMAZING. To Him be all the glory.

SUNDAY MORNING PRAYER

The big highlight this year has been the concentrated prayer month we had in September where we encouraged every person to be involved in at least one prayer meeting over the month. This drew a lot of people to come and pray and has meant our regular meeting now has more prayers coming to corporate prayer.

Our morning prayer is now more concentrated on the topic being preached on and the challenge that will be presented to each person. Each week, we meet before the service and read the Bible verses that will be read in church, pray for the things that will be talked about and pray for everyone who comes to church.

Again and again we see how our prayer allows God's Spirit to change lives and bring people closer to Him. Be encouraged that any time we spend in corporate prayer draws us closer to being where God wants us.

There are now three other prayer groups that meet on a Sunday morning with a specific focus. Before you arrive on Sunday, you have been prayed for. We would continue to challenge YOU to be one of the ones praying too – why not join a prayer meeting and go along at least once a month!

LADIES FELLOWSHIP & BIBLE STUDY

It has been a joy spending time with my ladies each month. We love getting together and enjoying each other's company.

We have lost three ladies this year. Gwenda Hatton, Thelma St George and Marjory Faithful passed onto our Lord.

I have a great committee. Margaret Mackwood Smith helps after Ken has setup tables. She is very busy when I arrive putting out hymn books and setting the tables. Marj McLaren brings us a wonderful morning tea and Margaret brings scones – thank you both. Also thanks to Elizabeth for the birthday flowers. Thank you Sharon for coming all the way from Howick to play the piano. Our speakers have been our own Grace Adams and Doug Snook with his shells. We always find time for a good laugh together.

We have been studying the ladies of the Old Testament. We meet regularly on a Tuesday. Tuesday is a busy day at church, but we love seeing all the parents and children in the café. We are a smaller group but we have enjoyed the lessons. But I'm sad to say since I have been unwell for sometime, we have had to cancel Bible Study for the later part of this year. Thank you ladies for coming each fortnight.

PRAYER CHAIN

Facts and Figures

2017 saw the Prayer Chain's biggest change with a handover of the Prayer Chain Coordinator position, from Pamela Cammell to Sarah Axford. Pamela had oversight of the prayer chain for almost 5 years and felt it was the right time to pass it on. Sarah took on the role in July 2017 and has been overseeing it since this time. When the prayer chain was handed over in July there were 49 current members some decided it was time to step down from serving on the prayer chain team at this time, whilst new team members came on board.

Since this time, the team has seen considerable growth and with the focus on prayer in September and the launch of 'Ignite' ministries we welcomed a further 25 new people during September alone – excitingly both "young and old".

The Prayer Chain now consists of 66 people in total. When a prayer request is made, 37 people are contacted by email, 28 people are contacted by text (a few people choose both options) and 5 people are contacted by telephone. It is awesome to see people grasp the heart of this ministry – serving others in prayer, whilst growing in their relationship with our amazing Father.

Prayer Requests

It's a real privilege to be contacted by people when they need prayer. The majority of prayer requests, currently come through people on the prayer chain itself and are relating to health needs of friends and family, or those they are connected with in their local neighbourhoods. However, we do get contact at times via the church office from people that are not part of the church but are living in the local community.

It is really exciting when the church is a beacon of light, when people are going through their darkest moments yet they feel able to make anonymous contact and specifically ask for prayer. In the last 3 months, overall as a team, we have received 2-3 requests each week on average. Most prayer requests currently come via email.

Prayer Chain Newsletter

This initiative was started in July 2017, and has the goal of summarising the "month gone" (prayer requests and praise reports) and presenting specific requests for the "month ahead" in the life of the church. It currently goes out to the whole team on 1st of each month. Over time, it would be great to see this include people's stories of answers to prayer, and also why people feel called to pray and be part of the prayer chain ministry.

Praise Reports

This is one of the most encouraging parts of this incredible ministry. Following are just some of the incredible comments/ feedback that we have received over the last 3 months:

"Baby came home yesterday and is doing really well. Please thank everyone for their prayers" – prayer requested for a friend's grandchild who was in NICU

"Please send my thank you out to the team. I had the best possible outcome" – Prayer requested by a lady who was experiencing significant pain and was due to have a medical appointment the following day.


"Thank you all on the prayer chain for your prayers. Surgery went without complications and was successful. Cancer was caught early" – prayer request from a person with a recent cancer diagnosis.

"Thank you for making contact, the family are doing as well as can be expected and the husband is now up and about working in the yard, preparing for Diwali and chatting to neighbours. Thank you for praying for his whanau" – prayer requested for a neighbour who had been attacked.

And what do we want to see for the Prayer Chain in 2018?

- To see the it used more widely, by people within the church and for it to be seen as a real power source within the church that can be accessed for a whole range of needs and in variety of ways (text, email, note, call etc.)
- For accessing the prayer chain to be part of people's toolbox when needing prayer, for themselves or for those within their community, and to see the value of taking a step to ask for prayer.
- To see an increase in praise reports as people feedback the outcome of their requests for prayer – to encourage those praying in their walk with God, but so that they can really focus on praying, with thanksgiving (Phillipians 4v6)
- To develop a sense of community within the prayer chain and the fact that each person has an important part to play in the team and is part of something bigger.

FAMILY LIFECARE

“When you are a new mum with a whole empty week stretching ahead it’s scary. But to have a place where you can come and build the tools to make those week days better has been awesome. Thank you.” *A mum who attended our 2017 Space for You and Your Baby programme.*

Some highlights this year from the Family Lifecare Centre include:

- Awhi Mai (Caring for Carers) began this year. This is a support group for those caring for others. Awhi Mai meets monthly for carers to pray, support, laugh and encourage each other in a confidential, safe and respectful way. Resources are swapped on how to keep looking to Jesus for strength and wisdom and to care for ourselves so carers can continue to care for their loved ones. Whilst needs, medical conditions, cultures, ways of coping or not coping varies, there are similarities each person who attends Awhi Mai share.
- 3 mums from our 2016 Space programme regularly continuing to come into our church buildings as they attend Mainly Music and Flavor Café on a Tuesday morning.
- Our English class has been helping our regular attendees as well as people who are in New Zealand visiting family for a short time.
- One non-Christian woman who attends our Job Club and English class is regularly serving at Flavor Café, building great relationships with others from our church.
- Brave New Life has continued to support those who are journeying through life after a partner’s death. This group is now becoming a connect group.
- With the support of Job Club, Frank has persevered and overcome

many obstacles to find a job where he is thriving and growing. Frank is just one of a number of Job Club members who have found work and a place where they belong.

- More MCBC members are volunteering at our various programs. They are seeing God at work and are developing relationships with people from our local community.
- New people are coming to our Space for You and Your Baby program because they’ve heard about it from others – word is spreading of how great this program is!



CHURCH HISTORIAN

Happy Birthday to us! This year, MCBC celebrates being around for 87 years...and we have only just begun!

The original Papatoetoe Baptist Church commenced the first All Ages Sunday School in New Zealand, an idea taken from Baptist Churches in America. For this to happen, a major building redevelopment took place with a brand new wing to house from babies to toddlers being built. While all this took place the church rented the Central Theatre for morning and evening services. In the evenings Dr. Billy Graham films were shown as a prelude to his first New Zealand Crusade to be held at Carlaw Park, with many new folk joining with us. The church was identified with the Crusade to be held in 1959 as a good church to attend.

The Reverend Foster Sherburd, a great Evangelist himself had a great love for people which reflected in many new folk attending. Praise the Lord! The existing church was repositioned and enlarged and the youth hall connected to the church to enable a bigger overflow congregation to see the pulpit area. Primary and intermediate groups had their own space. Most adult groups met in private homes close to the church.

The Puhinui church hall was shifted to St George Street and the opening of the All Ages Sunday School commenced on the 5th of October 1958. Many other churches wanted to visit and see it in operation on Sunday mornings from 9:30am. A Pastor of Christian Education was appointed to help with the training of teachers, Department leaders and secretaries, parking attendants and visiting personnel, with growing numbers enrolling to nearly 600 people in the first year.

Our heritage is important to us as a church. And innovation in the 1950's and pursuing what God had for our community was so important. And that doesn't change for us as a church today!






